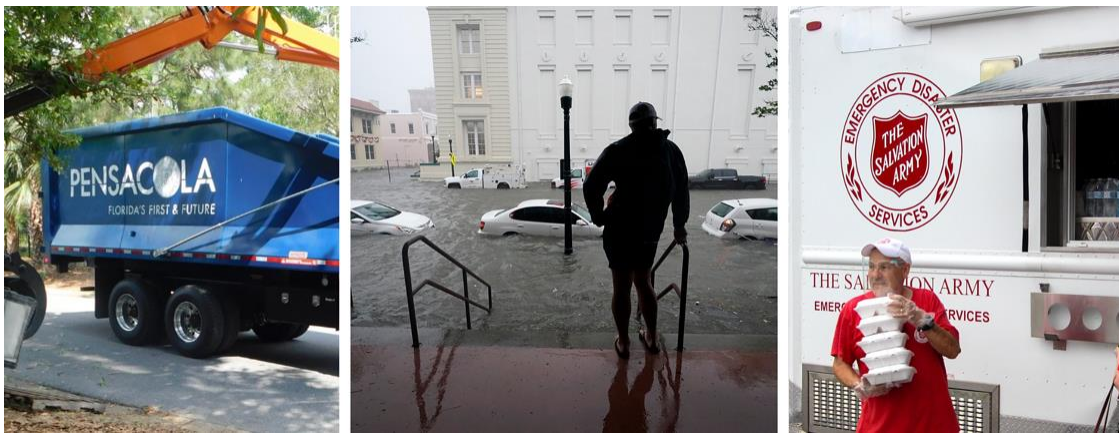

Food Resources: Our community is continuing to assist individuals without power, have significant damage, and/or are in need of food and supplies. Find updates for food pick up location date and times at: [Escambia](#), [Santa Rosa](#), [Okaloosa](#), [Walton](#), and [Mobile Food Pantry](#).



Power and Water Updates: By the end of today around 95% of even the hardest hit areas should have power restored. If power is restored to your area, and your power remains out make sure to check out your breakers and call the hotline at 800-487-6937. The boil water notice is still in effect and calls for residents to boil water for one minute at a rolling boil or to use eight drops of

regular unscented household bleach per gallon of water, for water to be used for drinking or cooking purposes.



Transportation Update: With the current closure of the 3 Mile Bridge, Garcon Point Bridge has dropped it toll until Wednesday night. Pensacola Beach Bridge is closed until further notice for all nonresidents or unessential personal. Police are stationed and will be checking IDs for all individuals crossing the bridge. The Bob Sikes Bridge is open. Buses will be up and running tomorrow and

CILNWF will continue to give more updates regarding public transportation.

HURRICANE SALLY HOME CLEANUP HOTLINE CALL: 800-451-1954

If you need assistance with damage from Hurricane Sally, call the number above to ask for help. We will connect you with volunteers from local relief organizations, community groups and faith communities who may be able to assist with:

-  Cut fallen trees
-  Drywall, flooring & appliance removal
-  Tarping roofs
-  Mold mitigation

All services are free, but service is not guaranteed due to the overwhelming need. This hotline will remain open through October 9, 2020.

PLEASE NOTE: this hotline CANNOT assist with social services such as food, clothing, shelter, insurance, or questions about FEMA registration. Volunteers work free of charge and provide the tools and equipment necessary to complete the work.



A Message to the Community from Hurricane Recovery Groups:

Please do not place yard debris in plastic garbage bags. Yard debris that is already bagged at the curb will be collected, but the plastic bags prevent the debris from being processed as yard waste. Yard debris should be placed curbside either loose or in paper bags. If items are not collected on the first

pass, please push them to the curb and they will be collected on the second pass. In order to remove debris as efficiently as possible, City of Pensacola Sanitation is requesting that residents separate debris into six different categories on the curb:

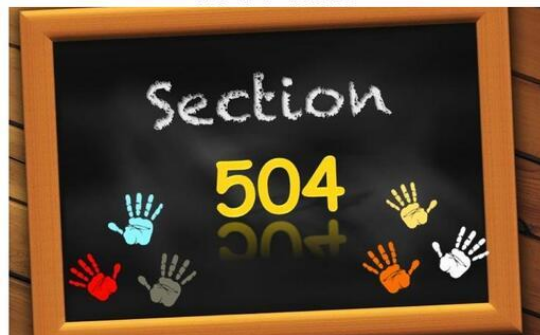
- **Electronics** such as televisions, computers, stereos, phones and DVD players.
- **Large appliances** such as refrigerators, washer/dryers, air conditioners, stoves, water heaters and dishwashers.
- **Hazardous waste** such as oil, battery, pesticide, paint, cleaning supplies and compressed gas.
- **Vegetative debris** such as tree branches, leaves, logs and plants.
- **Construction debris** such as building materials, drywall, lumber, carpet, furniture and plumbing.
- **Household garbage** such as bagged garbage, discarded food, paper and packaging.

Debris should not block the roadway and should avoid trees, poles, and other structures. The public's patience is appreciated during this time, as crews will be working diligently to remove debris as safely and efficiently as possible. Pick up will occur twice this week.

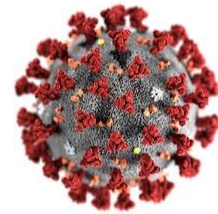
